Peace on Earth

Exhibition that addresses concerns for the environment and the fragility of ecosystems that support animal life. It explores the complex relationship between humankind and animals through the intersections of history, identity, technology and humankind's impact.

Woven Stories

Strength meets fragility, growth meets decay, nature meets technology, and fantasy meets reality in Woven Stories, a collection of narrative fiber artworks featuring 5 site-specific installations, 5 solo exhibitions, and a group exhibition.

L.A. Painting

A celebration of material, mark-making, and the human experience, boasting exhibitions curated by writer Cooper Johnson, performance artist Amy Kaps, painter Shane Guffogg's Circle of Truth project, a collaboration with 48 other artists, works by David Allan Peters, and site specific installation by Erika Lizée.

Photography: Beyond the Surface

Features the work of eight photographers, including a survey of Melanie Pullen's work in the Main Gallery, Joni Sternbach's Surfland series in the East Gallery, This Too Shall Pass by Matthew Finley in the North Gallery, Rob Grad's Finding Foreverland series in the Wells Fargo Gallery, work from Christopher Russel in the Moore Family Trust Gallery, photographic installation by Rodrigo Valenzuela in the South Gallery, along with sculpture by John Peralta, and 16mm, a site-specific installation, by Kira Vollman.

It Takes a Village

The Forest for the Trees

Comprised of five exhibitions addressing the complex relationships between people and the living and built environments they inhabit, specifically focusing on humans' symbiotic connection to trees. Special exhibitions by Greg Rose and Sant Khalsa.

The Robot Show

Comprised of eight exhibitions exploring the place robots, and other forms of artificial intelligence, have in a contemporary social landscape – from popular culture to nature and spirituality. Headlined by artist/ designer Dave Pressler.

The New Vanguard II

A dynamic group exhibition of works by international artists working in the New Contemporary art movement. The highly anticipated follow up to 2016's successful first iteration of The New Vanguard, on view in tandem with this year's POW WOW! Antelope Valley, guest curated by Thinkspace Projects.

Prison Arts Collective: Beyond the Blue

Beyond the Blue is a traveling exhibition of over 100 works of art. Created in California by incarcerated individuals participating in weekly arts programming through the Prison Arts Collective (PAC). The artists included seek to transform their lives through art and aim to shift society's stereotypical image of 'inmate' or 'prisoner' by sharing their personal expressions, goals, and talents to demonstrate their shared humanity.

An artistic alchemist, transforming collected materials into precious objects. Wyatt fuses the history of the materials together to create new beginnings, representing the cyclic nature of all things.

Kira Vollman/ Miya Ando

Blending traditional mediums such as painting, sculpture, photography and sound with found "treasures", Kira Vollman gives discarded items a second life.

In Miya Ando's installation Cathedral, visitors enter the ring of trees, created with gossamer silk chiffon panels and hope to create a tranquil and contemplative, immersive environment.

The art of Kokedama literally translates from "koke" meaning moss and "dama" meaning ball. This moss ball has experienced a resurgence as a modern art form useful for uniquely presented plants and flowers. A Japanese moss ball makes a personalized gift or simply an interesting accent for a favorite plant specimen.

REPTACULAR

Wild L.A. by Charles Hood Book Signing

Poet and artist Charles Hood's WILD L.A. has something for everyone.
